BEAD 2009, JULY 25 - For the past several years, the Beartooth Alliance has been concerned about the survival of pure strain Yellowstone cutthroat populations in streams flowing into Yellowstone National Park because of competition from brook trout, hybridization with rainbow trout, pollution, and whirling disease. This year's BEAD will feature a workshop of fisheries experts to discuss how to maintain healthy populations of Yellowstone cutthroats. Two of the eight panelists are Jason Burckhardt and Bruce Farling. Jason works for Wyoming Game and Fish and is responsible for fisheries management in the Beartooths and along the Chief Joseph Scenic Highway. Bruce is the Executive Director for Montana Council of Trout Unlimited and was recently named one of the 10 most important members of Trout Unlimited over the past 50 years. Listed below is a portion of the bylaws for your review:

Section 1. **Purposes.** The purposes for which this Corporation is formed are exclusively charitable, scientific, or educational and consist of the following:

- A. To act for the benefit of the communities of Colter Pass, Cooke City, and Silver Gate, through the promotion of projects that will benefit the health, safety, and welfare of those in the aforementioned communities.
- B. To establish and maintain a community center, which will educate community members and visitors about the unique geographical, environmental, and historical aspects of the communities.
- C. To support capital improvements to the community that will promote social welfare and combat community deterioration.
- D. To work with other public benefit corporations to provide educational and charitable experiences for members of the communities.
- E. To aid, support, and assist by gifts, contributions or otherwise, other corporations, community chests, funds and foundations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, scientific, or educational purposes, no part of the net earnings of which inures to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual, and no substantial part of the activities of which is carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation.
- F. To engage in related activities consistent with its charitable purposes as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- G. To do any and all lawful activities that may be necessary, useful, or desirable for the furtherance, accomplishment, fostering, or attainment of the foregoing purposes, either directly or indirectly and either alone or in conjunction or cooperation with others, whether such others be persons or organizations of any kind or nature, such as corporations, firms, associations, trusts, institutions, foundations, or governmental bureaus, departments, or agencies.

6.3 Qualifications: Directors shall be individuals with a connection to the communities of Colter Pass, Cooke City, and Silver Gate and may have such other qualifications as the Board may prescribe by resolution or amendment to these Bylaws.

DRINKING WATER WARNING

Cooke City Water District water is contaminated with *E. coli*

BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

E. coli bacteria (a fecal indicator) were found in the water supply on June 15, 2009. These bacteria can make you sick, and are a particular concern for people with weakened immune systems. Bacterial contamination can occur when increased run-off enters the drinking water source (for example, following heavy rains). It can also happen due to a break in the distribution system (pipes) or a failure in the water treatment process.

What should I do? What does this mean?

- **DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST.** Bring all water to a boil, let it boil for one minute, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and food preparation until further notice. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water.
- *Fecal coliforms and E. coli are bacteria whose presence indicates that the water may be contaminated with human or animal wastes. Microbes in these wastes can cause diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms. They may pose a special health risk for infants, young children, and people with severely compromised immune systems.*
- The symptoms above are not caused only by organisms in drinking water. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice. People at increased risk should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers.

What is being done?

Our system is under construction, we are chlorinating and flushing the water system as we switch to the temporary water lines. We are increasing sampling for coliform bacteria to determine the source of the contamination. We will inform you when tests show no bacteria and you no longer need to boil your water.
